Headteacher Comment:

In our assemblies, in class and in lessons we often learn about important historical figures or current role models. Mrs Jaycock was talking to me earlier in the week about the fact that today is the birthday of Malala Yousafzai who won the Nobel Peace Prize in 2014. Malala was persecuted for her role in campaigning for women and girls to be able to go to school and her prominence rose in 2012 when she was attacked for this belief. To us it may seem unthinkable that women can't attend school, but in some parts of the world this is the case still. Her campaigning has led to many more countries around the world accepting that women and girls should be allowed to attend school.
