## Headteacher Comment:

Every morning I go around each classroom and say good morning to the classes and see what they are doing. I often do this at different times of the day too. On Friday I did it accompanied by a photographer who was in school to take new photographs for us to use on our website, around the school and on the academy trust's website.

It was a normal Friday and we didn't put anything special on for this and yet the variety of learning that was taking place was brilliant. Every class teaches maths and English every morning and this was happening, but there were lots of other lessons taking place.

First off, we went out to the field where Year 4 were having a PE lesson. The sun was out and the field was freshly mown the day before and it looked great. There were plenty of action shots of children throwing, hitting and catching as they improved their rounders skills.

Then we headed off to the cooking kitchen where Year 5 were cooking. As part of their design technology work they had been learning about food from around the world all week, and having made some very tasty quesadillas the day before, they were making spring rolls. We are really lucky to have such a unique space in school, where children can cook every half term.

Next off was the computer suite where Year 2 were practising their maths skills that they had been learning in class. Again, another unique space we have in school where each child can develop their computer skills on one of the thirty computers.

We then popped into the other Year 2 class where they were in the middle of a music lesson. The xylophones were out and we got an excellent impromptu performance from the children.

Towards the end of the morning we made our way to the Reception classrooms, but stopped en route in the reading hub. I got to share some books with some of the Year 1 children in there – a book on chameleons was very interesting.

Once we got to Reception there were lots of exciting things going on. There was 'cooking' taking place in the mud kitchen. Digging in the vegetable plots was popular, as was showing me the worms that they kept finding. The beach shed was open, which is in fact a sand shed, and children were building with the sand. Others were on the mini-stage and writing on the chalk boards and there were some of them on the bikes and scooters. The provision was excellent.

As I said earlier, the normal lessons like maths and English were taking place, but our curriculum isn't just about those, it is about having a broad range of subjects that the children enjoy and this is what we saw on Friday. I'm sure the photographs will look amazing!

### Year 6 SATs

As you know, especially if you are a parent of a Year 6 child, the oldest children in the school took their end of Year 6 SATs this week. The children were fantastic and conducted themselves very well while trying their best and working hard. Because of the need for quiet and for them to take the tests undisturbed each morning, the rest of the school had to have their break times changed slightly and worked quietly in the classrooms while the tests were on. Well done everyone, staff and pupils, for a great week.
