Headteacher Comment:

Easter seems like a long time ago now even though we have only been back at school for a week, but I hope you all had a good break - it felt quite a long one.

I spoke previously about how the longer days with the warmer and sunnier weather (hopefully) can improve the way we feel. However, there are other things we can do to feel good. As you will remember, at the end of every week classes share three things that have been good for them as this means we end the week with a boost to our mental health.
