

# **Headteacher Comment:**

Keeping children safe and children feeling safe in school and in life are key priorities for all schools and it is something that we focus on daily at Larchwood. We do lots of things to ensure that our staff are able to support children with all their needs, whether they are educational needs, physical needs or emotional needs.

All our staff receive regular safeguarding training so that they are able to spot any signs that may be concerning regarding children coming to harm or being abused. This includes abuse they may get online or even with their peer group. Just last week, staff were asked to undertake midyear refresher training before we have a longer session again in September.

More and more children need emotional support and help with their mental health. That is why Mrs Jaycock has been trained as our Senior Mental Health Lead, why we have Heads to Minds in school providing Pet Assisted Therapy and why they did workshops with every class as well as running well attended parent workshops last term.

We have really close links with the school nursing team who work closely with us and families, not just on health-related matters, but also supporting children with things like anger, anxiety and dealing with the pressures of secondary school.

A visitor to the school this week, commented to me how good our staff's relationships were with pupils. We are fortunate to have a teacher and LSA in every class and this allows us to provide both the academic and emotional support that is needed for the children. Each child needs to feel that they can be themselves and be unique.

Lots of what we do with the children comes from our Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education (PSHCE) curriculum which is designed to support children with many aspects of their lives including keeping safe, being responsible and keeping physically and mentally healthy.

Outside of school there are many organisations that can support parents and families and it's worth signposting you to a few of these. Last week I was made aware of a brilliant app called Frontline Referral that has details of lots of organisations that can help. Find it here.
