Year 5 also had the opportunity to visit St Martin's School, one of our Trust schools, to watch a student performance of *Mary Poppins*. The production was very well done, and we were especially proud to see one of the main stars — playing the character of Bert — was a former Larchwood student. It's always lovely to see how our past pupils are getting on, and it made the visit even more meaningful for our children and staff.

On Tuesday evening, we welcomed the families of our new Reception cohort for their information meeting. It was great to be able to meet in person, and we're looking forward to the children starting with us in September. Starting school is a big step, and we're pleased to be beginning this journey together with our new families.

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














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
