Mr Bowsher's Headteacher Comment:

Despite the rather wet weather this week, school has been busy and full of positive energy, with lots of great learning taking place across all year groups. It has been great to see the children engaged in their lessons and continuing to show enthusiasm and curiosity, whatever the weather outside.

Our clubs also started this week, and it was fantastic to see so many children taking part and trying something new. A massive thank you goes to all the staff who give up their time to run these clubs – they are hugely valued and make a real difference to school life. Unfortunately, the persistent rain has meant that some lunchtime and after-school sports clubs have had to be cancelled for safety reasons. Fingers crossed that the rest of the term brings drier conditions.

You may have seen a recent news article regarding screen time for under 5s, particularly children under 2. The report highlights that many children under 5 are on devices lots with many under 2s on devices every day. Schools are increasingly seeing children start school with reduced language skills, as children and adults alike spend more time looking at screens rather than talking, playing and interacting. The first three years are crucial to a child's language development, but so is their entire childhood. My advice to all parents from the minute your child is born would be to spend as much time as possible playing, talking and interacting with your children, and to keep off devices.
