## Mr Bowsher's Headteacher Comment:

It has been a week full of learning and enjoyment for everyone across the school, with lots to celebrate both in and out of the classroom.

On Monday, our girls' football team played their quarter-final match in the Wiskard Cup. The team have shown real growth and determination throughout the year, and this was clear to see in their performance. Although they did not progress to the next round, they demonstrated excellent teamwork, resilience and sportsmanship against a very strong Shenfield St Mary's side. We are extremely proud of the way they represented the school and of the progress they have made as a team this year.

Yesterday, we were delighted to celebrate attendance with our attendance raffle winners at a wonderful tea party, kindly provided by our caterers, Pabulum. Twenty lucky pupils were each able to invite an adult to join them, and it was a lovely opportunity to recognise and reward their commitment to coming to school every day. Any pupil with attendance over 98% for the term is entered into the raffle. Our overall attendance continues to sit just above the national average, and when compared with similar schools, we are doing well. However, maintaining this remains a priority, as good attendance is vital for children's learning, progress and wellbeing.

It hasn't just been the children who have been learning this week. All staff have taken part in training delivered by the Essex SEND team, focusing on demand avoidance. These sessions are now a regular part of our professional development programme and ensure that staff receive up-to-date training to help us meet the needs of all pupils effectively.

Finally, today Miss Adams and I attended the BETT exhibition at Docklands alongside our Digital Leaders. BETT is a major educational technology event showcasing the very latest developments in edtech. We saw some fantastic innovations and have returned to school full of exciting ideas and plans for the future.

### **Governor Monitoring Visit – Rachel Fossey, Chair of Governors**

Last week I completed monitoring visits to review Assessment and Attainment outcomes as well as how the school spends the funds allocated to support children with the Pupil Premium Grant.

It is clear that school leaders regularly carry out a detailed review of all available assessment data and that individual class teachers identify any areas to address in their own class and are able to plan and carry out appropriate interventions.

A large proportion of the Pupil Premium Grant is spent on ensuring that there is high quality teaching as well as targeted support provided to those pupils who need it the most.
