## Headteacher Comment:

As teachers and school staff we are fortunate to spend our day with children and watch them grow physically, emotionally and academically into secondary ready children. By the time children leave Larchwood they are ready for this next journey.

We don't always know what the next part of the journey really looks like. If we are to believe the media, it will often paint a picture of teenagers who cause nothing but trouble. This is far from the truth, they will be working hard, passing important exams and heading off to work, college or university.

This week I was fortunate to be able to help Anglia Ruskin University (ARU), based in Chelmsford, interview prospective candidates for their new three-year teaching degree. This is a brand-new degree and the only new one approved by the DfE this year. ARU is also ranked 7<sup>th</sup> in the country for Education training in what is an extensive list. If I was starting my career again, I would be looking to train there.

The impressive campus and exciting course was not the biggest highlight though. It was interviewing 17 and 18 year olds who already had a passion for working with children and wanting to make a difference to their lives. They were aware of the long hours teachers work, the many, many jobs they do on top of teaching children and the challenges in the profession, but still wanted to be part of that. Many of them had already built up experience of working with children through T-levels, work experience and volunteering. They were a credit to themselves, their families and the schools that they have attended to this point. Many of them talked about a primary school teacher who had inspired them. It was a very positive experience for me to meet these brilliant young people.

The promotional material for this new course has pictures of our children on them and we have signed up to have some of these future teachers training at Larchwood. I can say with assurance that these teachers of the future are going to be a credit to the profession. It would be great to see the education journey for these young people end where it started, at primary school.
