It has been another busy week at Larchwood with much learning and enjoyment taking place.

On Monday Year 6 had an excellent art workshop with local artist Sue Mills; the work they produced inspired by David Hockney looks amazing. On Wednesday Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 had a theatrical Gruffalo workshop. The story teller was so engaging and watching the children enjoying the session was brilliant. Seeing the teachers that had to dress up was also very amusing! The children then got to do some art work based on the characters which will form a display in our hub.

Today we have had Kidzbop in school to perform and encourage children to complete their NSPCC mile for Childhood Day. Wednesday afternoon saw speakers from Smartphone Free Childhood come and speak to a group of parents about the dangers of children having smartphones and what parents can do about it. You will know from the news that there are increasing concerns about smartphones and children's mental health and well-being. They are encouraging parents to sign up to their parent pact to not give their children smartphones until they are older. Before the meeting they revealed that 47 Larchwood parents had already signed up to this which is fantastic. Although only Year 6 children are allowed to bring their phones on to the school site, they don't really have the need for this and the majority don't bring their phones in to school. Keeping children safe is one of our key responsibilities as a school and a key government document is Working Together to Safeguard Children.
