

Mr Bowsher's Headteacher Comment:

There is an increasing amount of talk in the news, on television and online about the use of social media and smartphones by children and the dangers to them. We know that by the time children go to secondary school, most of them will have a smartphone and will be online an awful lot.

We know that the pressures on children and parents to allow children to have smartphones is growing. I'm sure most of you have heard, or will hear at some point, them say, 'Can I have a phone, everyone has got one.' This will not be the case, but the pressure is huge and allowing them to have one is a parental choice.

The only children who are currently allowed to bring phones into school are Year 6 and they must be turned off before entering the school site and handed in immediately in class. Most of them don't bring a phone, and they don't have access to them during the day. However, we know that at home they will be online a lot, as will our younger children. We do a lot of work in our PSHCE and computing lessons to teach children to be safe and responsible online. The technology changes so quickly, it is hard for us as parents to keep up and keep our children safe. With that in mind there are a number of events coming up for parents that I'm sure you will find very useful.

Last week I was at a Headteacher's meeting for the Brentwood Collaborative Partnership (BCP) and an organisation called a Smartphone Free Childhood came to talk to us. They are doing some good work locally with parents and schools about the dangers of children having smartphones and trying to keep them away from the increasing dangers of social media, AI and inappropriate content. I know a number of our families have already signed up to their 'parent pact' to not let their children have a smartphone which is great. We have booked them to come and talk to parents on Wednesday 21 May and details will come out after Easter. If you are interested already, you can visit their website <u>here</u> and sign up to their parent pact.

The other event we have booked, again through the BCP, is an online meeting for parents with 'the 2 Johns' who will be talking about keeping children safe online, if and when they are allowed on. Again, details will come out after Easter, but the event is on 1 May in the early evening.




