The children enjoyed interacting with these historical items, learning more about their importance. This activity allowed the children to appreciate the significant history behind this important day.

In the afternoon, every class went out onto the field to take part in games, some similar to those played in 1945. Drinks and snacks were provided by the LPPA. As well as a fun filled afternoon the day also connected directly to our history curriculum. Year 4 is currently studying World War II, and the VE Day celebrations provided a timely and meaningful context for their learning, reinforcing what they are exploring in class.

Next week sees Year 6 taking their SATs. All Year 6 children around the country will be taking these. The children have been working hard in preparation for this and it is a time to demonstrate what they have learnt in primary school. All we ask is that they try their best and I'm sure they will.
