Headteacher's Comment:

Despite school not finishing until next Thursday, this is the last News and Views of the academic year so I thought I would take some time to reflect on the year that has passed as well as look ahead to next year.

So many things have happened this year it is hard to remember them all. The impact of Covid this year can't be ignored. It has had a significant impact on both pupils and staff, yet we have continued to make sure that children are learning and getting back on track from the lost learning over the previous two years. Now we are at the end of the year we can see that through the hard work of pupils, staff and parents we are getting back to where we used to be. The data for things like the number of children who get a Good Level of Development in Reception, the percentage who pass the phonics screening test and the SATs results in KS1 and KS2 are all strong and above the national comparison.

We have also had success in other areas. We have taken part in more sporting events than ever, winning the district KS2 Panathalon games and the archery as well as securing the gold again in the School Games Mark. All of our school trips were hugely successful, sports day was amazing, our Jubilee afternoon was a brilliant event and just yesterday the Year 6 leavers play was performed to a thrilled audience.

We are about to say farewell to the first cohort of sixty children that joined the school as part of the expansion. Those seven years have flown by and it is both a little sad to see them go, but also exciting to know they are ready for the next stages of their education at secondary school. Please keep in touch and I look forward to hearing how you are all doing.

Each year we present the Smith Family Award to a child in Year 6. The Smith family have a long connection with Larchwood. It isn't necessarily awarded to the child who does the best academically or who achieves the most, but the child that we feel best represents our school ethos and values. It was extremely difficult to decide this year who that person would be, but yesterday the trophy and book token was awarded to Hassan in 6S. Congratulations to him; his name will be added to the honours board in the lobby.

As you already know, we are also saying farewell to Mr Sumner who has taught in Year 5 and 6 for the last nine years and to Mr Shrimplin who has taught in Reception since 2019. Mrs Wagner, who has worked as one of our cover teachers is also moving on. A big thank you to all of them for their contributions to the school and the children. You will be missed.

Over the summer we are having significant work done at the school. The paths into the school are being replaced, but more significantly we are having a new roof put on large parts of the school. The older parts of the building which incorporates Year 1, Year 4, Year 5, the computer suite, half the hall and the kitchen has an old flat roof that is close to leaking and is very worn. This year we were successful in a bid to the government for funding to replace this roof with a

grant of over £400,000. Scaffolding is due to go up next Friday and work will start the week after. This will be continuing in the autumn term, but school will continue to run as normal. We will of course be prioritising the safety and well-being of the children during this time.
