Headteacher's Comment:

Every Wednesday I sit and have lunch with the children in the dinner hall and this Wednesday was no different. I sat with a group of Year 2 children and asked them about their current learning, which is a science block on plants. We talked about what they have been learning so far and started to talk about the parts of a plant.

The conversation went on to how bees feed off nectar and how by doing this they pollinate the plants. It then moved on to how important bees and insects are for pollination and how bees are particularly attracted to flowers that are blue and why we should be growing these in our gardens. The children were able to understand how the work of biologist is important. It was a great conversation to have with a group of 7-year olds and showed how what they learn in science fits into our curriculum aims of understanding the world around them.

This week we have had a number of events at the school where parents have been able to come on site for the first time in two years due to the pandemic. On Tuesday we had our new Reception parent's meeting in the hall. As always this was extremely well attended and feedback from the parents was how informative it was. It was great to meet our new parents (and a few familiar ones) as they start their journey with us.

This was acknowledged by Ofsted when grading Chase High 'Good' in February, the first time in the school's history.
