Headteacher's Comment:

In assembly this week Mrs Rushmer shared the story of The Boy Who Cried Wolf. I'm sure most of you know the story of the boy who pretended there was a wolf about to attack when there wasn't. When there actually was, nobody believed him. It is a prime example of why our value of honesty is so important.

We also expect all adults to demonstrate the value of honesty. This goes for staff as well as parents. We are honest with children about things like their work and talk to them about when it is good, but also what children can do to improve. By just saying well done all the time won't help them get better. We always start with the positive, but if needed give advice on how to get better.

The same goes for parents, we expect honesty from you. We are part of a team working together so when a parent isn't honest with us, it is disappointing. For example, very occasionally a parent may decide to keep their child off school to go away on a Friday and call the school to say they are unwell, we usually know this isn't the case – the children tell us! Are you being honest with us and demonstrating the value to your children? This is another reason why all of us being honest is so important.

Over the last 6 News and Views, I have now talked about all the school values. Respect, Responsibility, Friendship, Fairness, Perseverance and Honesty. They are key to everything we do and they underpin our philosophy. By all children and adults in our community following these values it means that we have the great school that we do.

Local Schools Committee – Governance Update

We met this week for our termly update from Mr Bowsher who presented us with information on the progress pupils are currently making, finance, and attendance amongst other things. We asked questions about the building work to the roof, approved the anti-bullying policy and agreed our monitoring roles in relation to the new School Improvement Plan. Lisa Wenham shared reports of her recent school visit for safeguarding. Mercedes Romero-Fernandez was elected as the Vice Chair and Rachel Fossey's role was changed from Parent Governor to Coopted Governor in order to continue as Chair, which means there will be a vacancy for a new Parent Governor – elections will be open to all current parents – watch this space!
