Headteacher's Comment:

Giving children a wealth of experiences is one of the aims of our curriculum. It didn't take me long to think of examples of how we have done this at Larchwood this week. Here are just three of the examples that immediately sprung to mind:

Year 4 cooking – every class does this every half term.

Year 2 Exotic Explorers visit – the children who touched the snake were braver than me.

Road Safety Talk - Essex Police visited on Monday to talk to the children in assembly.

One of the biggest experiences that happened this week was World Book Day. It is always a highlight and children are so excited. It would be very easy to lose the real point of World Book Day with all the dressing up, but we believe we get the real message out about developing a love of reading.

Each class also got to pair up with a class lower down the school and share reading. I happened to walk through our Hub and was privileged to see one of the infant classes reading with a partner from one of the junior classes. It was a lovely thing to witness.
